May 2023: "Looking Back" (Part I)

Since the announcement was made that Christina and I will be moving to the Plymouth area in July, I have been doing a lot of reflection on my time here as pastor. This month I would like to reflect on three things I have learned around pastoring in the community.



Being Appointed to the Church and Community

When I received my first appointment as a pastor in 2009, Bishop Linda Lee shared with us that while we were appointed to a church or churches, we were also appointed to the community in which we are located. I have taken this to heart in my time here. During my tenure as pastor to Dodgeville and Ridgeway, I have participated in worship services and nursing homes in five different facilities. I have been part of a rotation of pastors that have offered worship services in the old *and* new jails in Iowa County. I have served on the Dodgeville Library Board of Trustees, have volunteered as a LIFT driver for SWCAP, have served as chaplain for Upland Hills Hospice, served on a committee seeking to provide housing for homeless families in Iowa and Lafayette counties, among other opportunities. Dodgeville and Ridgeway have become my home in a way I have not experienced because I have become invested in the communities, those *in* the communities, and have worked for the wellbeing of the communities.

As a church planter, it will be critical for me to immerse myself in the Plymouth community. I have been given the freedom to be immersed in the Dodgeville and Ridgeway communities and this is something that I want to continue to do!

Begin Ecumenical

I can remember that in my transition report from the previous pastor when it came to ecumenical partnerships and events it was written, "None at this time; this has been very difficult in Dodgeville." Pastor Joylynn Graham of Plymouth UCC reached out to Carla after I had been here a few months looking to see if I was able to get together for coffee. We later reached out to Pastor Mark Williamson of the Lutheran Church. They were also told similar things about ecumenical partnerships! Since then, we have had a pastor's group that has met at *least* monthly (*except for COVID*) and we have partnered on many different worship services and events. We have been greatly blessed by these partnerships and I am confident that these relationships will continue.

I have gotten to know several of the pastors in Dodgeville and in the surrounding communities. I consider many of them to be friends *and* colleagues in ministry. Because of these friendships and relationships, I have developed a critical support system in my time here where I can ask questions, seek advice, and wrestle with the difficulties of ministry.

This passion for ecumenical partnerships is something that I will carry with me to my next appointment. In seeking to plant a new church in a community, these partnerships *will* be critical.

Funerals as "Celebrations of Life"

In my previous appointment in Oakfield and Eden, I participated in two to three funerals each year. In the eight years that I have served as pastor in this community I have presided at well over 125 funerals. Having presided at 25 alone in 2022, I found myself coming into this year spiritually exhausted. We said goodbye to some *very* dear members this past year, and I have had to say farewell to many members of the church that I cared for deeply.

When we say goodbye to someone who has died, we grieve, but we also celebrate their life *and* the new life that they have in Jesus Christ. I have officiated in many church *and* community funerals in which I am reminded of the eternal reward that comes with a relationship with Jesus Christ. This is a reminder that I will carry with me throughout my pastoral service.

All of this would not be possible at all without the support and

encouragement of the Staff/Parish Relations Committee that encouraged me to forge those ecumenical and community partnerships. So, thank you!

A CHICKEN OR AN EAGLE?

"Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God — what is good and acceptable and perfect." (Romans 12:2)
